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La forma del derecho pretende explicar el derecho entendiendo que esa explicación no es aclaración conceptual, sino inteligibilidad institucional, que la teoría del derecho busca hacer inteligibles instituciones que efectivamente existen. Para eso, este libro introduce y desarrolla una teoría de los conceptos jurídicos y las instituciones que luego es aplicada a las estructuras fundamentales que definen el derecho moderno. El libro está estructurado en tres partes, que se presentan como círculos concéntricos. La primera comienza con algunas disputas tradicionales de la teoría del derecho, en particular sobre el denominado «positivismo jurídico» y sus versiones «duras» y «blandas». Pero no lo hace con el ánimo de sumar una voz más a un debate que parece cada vez más trillado, sino para mostrar que esa discusión ha perdido de vista lo que en la propia tradición positivista era originalmente fundamental: la afirmación y defensa de una comprensión-idea moderna de derecho. Esta comprensión del derecho es el tema de la segunda parte. Ahí ella es tratada no como una teoría, sino como un conjunto de instituciones estructuradas sobre la base de la distinción entre jurisdicción, legislación y administración. La teoría del derecho no ha prestado atención a esta distinción. Aunque ha discutido la primera con obsesión, y recientemente ha vuelto su atención a la segunda, la tercera, y en particular la relación entre ellas, no ha sido tematizada. La forma del derecho, como entiende que la teoría del derecho busca inteligibilidad institucional, asume la posición contraria: comienza asumiendo que en esas características fundamentales hay algo importante para entender la idea moderna de derecho, y procede reconstruyendo desde abajo. Pero la inteligibilidad de las instituciones que realmente existen supone entender el «modo de significación» del discurso sobre ellas. Este es el tema de la tercera parte, que pretende mostrar que el modo de significación del derecho y la teoría

política es el mismo que el de la teología. Ignorar este modo especial de significación fuerza sobre las instituciones actualmente existentes una comprensión ingenua o cínica, que las hace aparecer como fundadas en ideas muertas.

A Deleuzian reading of Whitehead and a Whiteheadian reading of Deleuze open the possibility of a critical aesthetics of contemporary culture. In *Without Criteria*, Steven Shaviro proposes and explores a philosophical fantasy: imagine a world in which Alfred North Whitehead takes the place of Martin Heidegger. What if Whitehead, instead of Heidegger, had set the agenda for postmodern thought? Heidegger asks, "Why is there something, rather than nothing?" Whitehead asks, "How is it that there is always something new?" In a world where everything from popular music to DNA is being sampled and recombined, argues Shaviro, Whitehead's question is the truly urgent one. *Without Criteria* is Shaviro's experiment in rethinking postmodern theory, especially the theory of aesthetics, from a point of view that harkens back to Whitehead rather than Heidegger. In working through the ideas of Whitehead and Deleuze, Shaviro also appeals to Kant, arguing that certain aspects of Kant's thought pave the way for the philosophical "constructivism" embraced by both Whitehead and Deleuze. Kant, Whitehead, and Deleuze are not commonly grouped together, but the juxtaposition of them in *Without Criteria* helps to shed light on a

variety of issues that are of concern to contemporary art and media practices.

On the morning of February 6, 1999, Buenos Aires police officers shot and killed seventeen-year-old Víctor Manuel Vital, better known as Frente, while he was unarmed, hiding under a table, and trying to surrender. Widely known and respected throughout Buenos Aires's shantytowns for his success as a thief, commitment to a code of honor, and generosity to his community, Frente became a Robin Hood--style legend who, in death, was believed to have the power to make bullets swerve and save gang members from shrapnel. In *Dance for Me When I Die*—first published in Argentina in 2004 and appearing here in English for the first time—Cristian Alarcón tells the story and legacy of Frente's life and death in the context of the everyday experiences of love and survival, murder and addiction, and crime and courage of those living in the slums.
