Results, Discussion & Conclusion - AP Biology Labs This experiment will determine the rate of photosynthesis in the presence or absence of carbon dioxide. What is the purpose? The lab tests the rate of photosynthesis within or without the presence of carbon dioxide. Because photosynthesis needs the carbon dioxide to produce glucose and energy for the Calvin cycle, the experiment is to determine whether or not the production rate of oxygen will be influenced due to lack of carbon dioxide. Like all enzyme-driven reactions, the rate of photosynthesis can be measured by either the disappearance of substrate, or the accumulation of products. The equation for photosynthesis is: $6\text{CO}_2 + 6\text{H}_2\text{O} \xrightarrow{\text{light}} \text{C}_6\text{H}_{12}\text{O}_6 + 6\text{O}_2 + \text{H}_2\text{O}$.

Answer 1: "In choosing the wavelength setting for the spectrophotometer in the photosynthesis lab, you are trying to find a wavelength at which you can most easily see changes in absorbance by DCPIP against a background of absorbance by chlorophyll. So you are not necessarily choosing the wavelength at which DCPIP absorbance is greatest, or the wavelength at which chlorophyll absorbance is lowest.

AP Biology: Lab 4: Plant Pigments and Photosynthesis | AP ...The process of photosynthesis occurs in a series of enzyme-mediated steps that capture light energy to build energy-rich carbohydrates. The process is summarized by the following reaction: $2\text{H}_2\text{O} + \text{CO}_2 + \text{light} \rightarrow \text{carbohydrate} (\text{CH}_2\text{O}) + \text{O}_2 + \text{H}_2\text{O}$
