I have written this book in an effort to explore how the history of Pakistan has resulted in the critical problems weighing down its education system.

The book examines the questions: Why and how has a small elite class come to rule Pakistan? And how has their rule worsened the country's problems? The focus will be to critically examine the elements of the Pakistani national curriculum and madrasas and their effects on Pakistani society. The book represents the fusion of my experiences in Pakistan with extensive literature analysis, interviews, and textbook analysis. This research began when I came to the United States in January 2015 through the SAR program. I wanted to know the answers to profoundly unsettling questions. How can a society be so intolerant that a scholar educated solely in Pakistan is disregarded and assassinated while many Western-educated scholars with traditional insular thoughts are not only appreciated but flourishing? I wanted to know why Pakistani elites have so much power and freedom while lower classes are profoundly oppressed. Elites who barely pay taxes have been in power for generations while those that pay taxes suffer from sky-high inflation. The influential religious leaders mostly belong to the elite class while their followers are mostly lower class. Ruling families and social classes mostly control appointed positions. Do those in power not have a responsibility to speak on issues of social justice rather than limiting themselves in claiming that theirs is the only true form of Islam? Why don't they work to end the disparity of quality education between classes in Pakistan? Instead, many elites run their own lucrative elite Islamic schools. More importantly, why do the ulama (which literally means "those who possess knowledge [ilm], particularly of Islam") maintain a tight hierarchical system in the madrasa (Islamic seminary) community that rarely allows poor intelligent students to attain leadership positions? Why are the ulama silent in the face of ruthless murder of and discrimination against Pakistani minorities? All necessary explanations have been incorporated right there in the text with italic type setting to differentiate from the translation of the meanings of Qur'anic Arabic Text. (4) Outline of Pertinent Information: Before the start of each Srah, information relating to its Period of Revelation, Major Issues, Divine Laws and Guidance has been presented as an outline. Then a summary of the preceding events has been tabulated for the reader to understand the histo! rical background to grasp the full meaning of the Divine Message. (5) Reviews, Input and Approvals: This project was started in 1991 and initial draft completed in 1994. Then the Translation was sent to different Ulema (Scholars) in Town and throughout United States for their review and input. After their reviews and input it was sent to Jme Al-Azhar Al-Sharif in Egypt, Ummal Qur in Saudi Arabia and International Islamic University in Pakistan for their review, input and approval. This translation was published after their reviews and approvals.

Academic right consists of providing right answers and doing well in school. However, students have to learn not only right answers but the right way to present them. In social terms, the students learn to comply with the school rules. However, under certain circumstances they may circumvent them or even establish their own rules. They also construct a complex system of relationships with their peers, whom they categorize work friends, play friends and coworkers. Morally, the children's learning in large part involves formal religious and moral instruction in their Islamiat class. However, they also learn moral lessons in other subjects when the teacher consciously reinforces the religious morals, or spontaneously through informal remarks by teachers. Some of their moral principles-caring, compassion, kindness, fairness-appears to be independent of this background and the students may act on them independently. This inquiry examined how 4 Class 1 students in a private school in Pakistan learn about right and wrong. The study grew out of the lack of literature on young children's learning, and moral learning in particular, in a Pakistani context. Even Western studies of childhood education have largely focused on administrators' or teachers' viewpoints and on curricular matters. On the basis of these findings. I discuss the significance and implications of the study in terms of teachers' and my own practice, education in Pakistan, and the literature on children's education generally. After a review of the literature, I decided on one major research question: How do primary students of Class 1 in a private school in Pakistan learn about right and wrong?My three subsidiary questions were: (a) How do students learn right and wrong in teaching situations, within the formal and the informal curriculum in various subjects and in religion (Islamiat) classes? (b) How do students learn right and

wrong from critical incidents or situations where the teacher determines acceptable or unacceptable behavior, or from school rules and routines that and set by the teacher or by others in authority? and, (c) How do students learn right and wrong from the informal spontaneous interactions with teachers, peers, Head teacher, support staff and others in the school? To capture the experience of learning from the children's viewpoint, I decided on a qualitative case study method. My participants were 3 boys and 1 girl, ages 5.5 to 6.5 years in a Class 1 section of 34 students in the ABC English-medium Private School, Karachi, Pakistan. For 5 months from October 2001 to February 2002, I collected data through participant observations of classes, structured and unstructured interviews, informal chats and conversations with the students and their teacher, students'

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drawings and stories, school literature, and general observation of the school and classes. Analysis of the data revealed that the students learn about right and wrong from three perspectives---academic, social, and moral. They learned about any or all three areas in any of the three contexts I was investigating---formal instruction, rules and social interactions, and spontaneous moments. Furthermore, to successfully learn how to do right from any one perspective often involved mastery of right behavior in one or both of the others. An unexpected finding was the important role of their Islamiyat and class teacher as an "ethical practitioner."
