The reason for this is that without stated objectives, there is no measure of whether a particular lesson plan produces the desired learning results. Therefore, you need to spend time before creating a lesson plan by writing effective objectives. Focus of Lesson ObjectivesEffective Lesson Objectives - ThoughtCoWhen writing a performance objective for a lesson plan, include (1) the task, (2) the condition, and (3) the criteria. Task (what): The main part of a performance objective involves a task or behavior.
