The ideal of childhood innocence is perhaps the most cherished concept of modern Western culture, all the more so because it seems to be under siege.

Pictures have always been crucial to that ideal, and now they promise to transform it. *Pictures of Innocence* begins by tracing the visual history of ideal childhood: the pictorial invention of childhood innocence in eighteenth-century portraits, its

diffusion in nineteenth-century popular paintings and illustration, and its culmination in today's best-selling and most widely practiced forms of photography. It deals with pictures of many sorts, ranging from eighteenth-century portraits by Sir Joshua Reynolds to greeting cards by Anne Geddes, from the controversial photographs of Lewis Carroll to those of Sally Mann.
