Finally, he recounts, in a touching manner, how Zafar spent his last days in Rangoon (where he had been exiled by the British) - a lonely and forgotten

individual - far away from his beloved Delhi and from the trappings of his empire.

The international multi-topic conference IMTIC 2008 was held in Pakistan during April 11-12, 2008. It was a joint venture between Mehran University, Jamshoro, Sindh and Aalborg University, Esbjerg, Denmark. Apart from the two-day main event, two workshops were also held: the Workshop on Creating Social Semantic Web 2.0 Information Spaces and the Workshop on Wireless Sensor Networks. Two hundred participants

registered for the main conference from 24 countries and 43 papers were presented; the two workshops had overwhelming support and over 400 delegates registered. The topics presented had a reasonable balance between theory and

The Program Committee and various other committees were experts in their areas and each paper went through a double-blind peer review process. The conference received 135 submissions of which only 46 papers were selected for presen-
