In other words, to observe and draw what we actually see, rather than what we think we see. When it comes to drawing the human figure,

this means letting go of learned ideas and expectation of what the figure should look like. It means carefully observing the interplay of form and light, shape and line, that combine to create the actual appearance of human form.
