Why did an entirely new social institution, the coffeehouse, emerge as the primary place for consumption of this new drink? ground. Today he's chair of their School of the Arts film division. Jamal Joseph's personal odyssey—from the streets of Harlem to Riker's Island and Leavenworth to the halls of Columbia—is as gripping as it is inspiring.
