Immediately after the Messiah — which was created in the twenty four days from August 22 to September 14, 1742 — Handel advanced to the composition of Samson. The commencement of the work is not dated; but by September 29, fourteen days after the completion of Messiah, the first act was completed; the second act was finished by October 11, and the work was finished on October 29, 1741. His most notable works include: "Water Music", "Music for the Royal Fireworks", and "Messiah".
