The feted American investor, Peridot Resorts LLC, and their local business partner, Toyodai, became pariahs overnight but the governor is determined to push through with development as the financial and political stakes are too high. The battle lines are drawn up where the minnow Ainus looked doomed to lose until the most unexpected saviour rose among their ranks. Aided by the invisible hands of unseen actors, the Ainus head for a showdown with the powers that be, but there may be more that meets the eye and it is unclear who's friend and who's foe. Octogenarians, such as myself enjoy thinking about those adventures in a long life that continue to energize our memory banks The stories collected in this book are true and illustrate a time when museums were less bureaucratic and more idiosyncratic than most of them are today. But idiosyncrasy was exactly the circumstance of the "Nation's Attic" when I joined that community of scholars and researchers back in the mid twentieth century. A Manitoba mother and a Quebec father, an American and Canadian life split more or less equally, can do that to an inquisitive and absorptive child. I married India, a beautiful and complicated world, and that Canadian/American,

The stories in *World Body* (Volume 4 of *New and Selected Stories*) reflect a few of those non-North American experiences. I now live in California, but my California, strangely, presents itself through Indian eyes.
