Whether shooting portraits or products, skillful lighting can be the difference between a

bland snapshot and a stunning, well-defined image. Capturing the ideal photograph requires many technical factors to work in tandem, the most fundamental of which is lighting. It is the way the light has been modified and shaped that gives the photographer the ability to create an
