There's no right way to keep a diary, but if there's an entertaining way, David Sedaris seems to have mastered it. Time marches on, and Sedaris, at his desk or on planes, in fine hotel dining rooms and Serbian motels, records it. The entries here reflect an ever-changing background-new administrations, new
