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A paraphrase / ˈ p æ r ə f r eɪ z / is a restatement of the meaning of a text or passage using other words. The term itself is derived via Latin paraphrasis from Greek παράφρασις, meaning "additional manner of expression". The act of paraphrasing is also called "paraphrasis".

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Paraphrasing is taking a particular passage and adapting it in their unique way. The significance of paraphrasing is that it reflects the understanding of the individual on that specific topic. It also helps the writer to write a plagiarism free content. There is a difference between paraphrasing and summarizing.

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Paraphrasing is best used for long portions of text that you can synthesize in your own words. Think of paraphrasing as a form of translation; you are translating an idea in another "language" into your own language. 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How can I learn to paraphrase? There are lots of ways that you can develop your skills in paraphrasing. 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Paraphrasing Paraphrasing is presenting ideas and information in your own words and acknowledging where they come from. By using your own words, you demonstrate your understanding and your ability to convey this information.

A paraphrase restates another's idea (or your own previously published idea) in your own words. Paraphrasing allows you to summarize and synthesize information from one or more sources, focus on significant information, and compare and contrast relevant details.

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Paraphrasing means formulating someone else's ideas in your own words. To paraphrase a source, you have to rewrite a passage without changing the meaning of the original text. Paraphrasing is an alternative to quoting, where you copy someone's exact words and put them in quotation marks.
