To most of us, learning something "the hard way" implies wasted time and effort. Good teaching, we believe, should be creatively tailored to the different learning styles of students and should use strategies that make learning easier. Grappling with the impediments that make learning challenging leads both to more complex

mastery and better retention of what was learned. Many common study habits and practice routines turn out to be counterproductive. Underlining and highlighting, rereading, cramming, and single-minded repetition of new skills create the illusion of mastery, but gains fade quickly. More complex and durable learning come from self-testing, introducing certain difficulties in practice, waiting to re-study new material until a little forgetting has set in, and interleaving the practice of one skill or topic with another. Speaking most urgently to

students, teachers, trainers, and athletes, *Make It Stick* will appeal to all those interested in the challenge of lifelong learning and self-improvement.

A Catalogue of the Archiepiscopal Manuscripts in the Library at Lambeth Palace Boydell & Brewer

This catalogue describes MSS 1-247 and 298 in the Chapter Library of Lincoln Cathedral, plus ten former Lincoln MSS now elsewhere. About half of the MSS were part of the cathedral's medieval library; nearly all the rest came therebefore the late seventeenth century. Among the MSS, which date from the eighth to the early sixteenth century, are biblical commentaries and sermons, works of pastoral theology and an important corpus of Middle English texts, including the famous Thornton Romances. A group of MSS written at the Cathedral c.1100 is notable for its distinctive decoration. The Catalogue is preceded by a history of the

Cathedral Library, based on the rich documentary evidence, which includes two medieval catalogues. The plates illustrate bindings, ownership marks, important decoration and noteworthy script, including samples from all signed and dated books.

We invite you to study 1 Timothy with us alongside Matthew Henry! Matthew Henry (1662-1714) was a Nonconformist minister and author who was born in Wales, but spent much of his life in England. Henry's commentaries are primarily exegetical, dealing with the scripture text as presented, with his prime intention being explanation, for practical and devotional purposes. Henry's Exposition gives the result of a critical account of the original as of his time, with practical application. It was considered sensible and stylish, a commentary for devotional purposes. Famous evangelical Protestant preachers such as George Whitefield and Charles

Spurgeon used and heartily commended the work, with Whitefield reading it through four times - the last time on his knees. Spurgeon said that "[e]very minister ought to read it entirely and carefully through once at least." [Christus Vivit](#) Springer Nature

Paul's first letter to Timothy is a personal, yet theologically robust, letter which reminds the church of her identity and responsibility. The connection between identity and responsibility is the theme which ties the seemingly disparate sections of this letter together. In the heart of the epistle (1 Tim 3:14-16) Paul uses a metaphor, "house of God," to identify the church as the place of God's presence. In 1 Timothy 1, Paul reminds his young coworker that since he is the steward of God's house, he must utilize the truth of the gospel in a battle against the false teachers. In the second chapter, the apostle teaches the church about the priority and propriety of prayer. In 1 Timothy 3, Paul concludes a discussion about proper roles for men and women in the context of church leadership. The fourth chapter calls Timothy to train himself for godliness, and the fifth reveals

what such godliness will look like in practice. In the letter's final chapter, Paul indicts the false teachers concerning their love of money before encouraging Timothy to recognize the true value of wealth. The reality that the church is the place of God's presence lies behind each of Paul's exhortations.

John Wesley (1703-1791) was an Anglican cleric and theologian who, with his brother Charles and fellow cleric George Whitefield, founded Methodism. Wesley wrote, edited or abridged some 400 publications. As well as theology he wrote about music, marriage, medicine, abolitionism and politics. Wesley was a logical thinker and expressed himself clearly, concisely and forcefully in writing. His written sermons are characterized by spiritual earnestness and simplicity. They are doctrinal but not dogmatic. His Forty-Four Sermons and the Notes on the New Testament are

Methodist doctrinal standards. Wesley was a fluent, powerful and effective preacher; he usually preached spontaneously and briefly, though occasionally at great length.

Analysis of the literary scheme of the letters to Timothy suggests that *graphe*, as it is employed in each letter, may legitimately be understood to include some of the apostolic writings that now appear in the New Testament. In affirming the Pauline authorship of the Pastoral Epistles, Swinson argues that a form of the Gospel of Luke stands as the source of the second referent of *graphe* in 1 Tim 5:18. Second, Swinson contends that *pasa graphe* in 2 Tim 3:16 includes the apostolic writings extant in Paul's day, specifically Luke's Gospel and some of Paul's own writings. These parallel lines of analysis demonstrate that Paul ascribes to

his own writings and to those of his coworkers an authoritative standing equal to that of the sacred writings (*ta hiera grammata*) found in the Old Testament. While many questions surrounding biblical authority and the biblical canon remain, Paul's use of *graphe* in 1 and 2 Timothy nevertheless advances a high view of both Old Testament and New Testament Scripture.
