**Nat Turner and the Rising in Southampton County** John Wiley & Sons

In August 1831, in Southampton County, Virginia, Nat Turner led a bloody uprising that took the lives of some fifty-five white people—men, women, and children—shocking the South. Nearly as many black people, all told, perished in

the rebellion and its aftermath.
