Confluence Narratives: Ethnicity, History and Nation-Making in the Americas explores how a collection of contemporary novels calls attention to the impact of ethnicity on national identities in the Americas. These historical narratives portray the cultural encounters—the conflicts and alliances, peaceful borrowings and violent seizures—that have characterized the history of the

American continents since the colonial period. In the second half of the twentieth century, North and South American readers have witnessed a steady output of novels that revisit moments of cultural confluence as a means of revising national histories. Confluence Narratives proposes that these historical novels, published in such places as Brazil, Argentina, Mexico, the United States, and Canada, make up a key literary genre in the Americas. The genre links the various parts of the hemisphere together through three common historical experiences: colonization, slavery, and immigration. Luciano Tosta demonstrates how numerous texts from the United States, Canada, Spanish America, the Caribbean, and Brazil fall into the genre. The book focuses on four case studies from ethnic groups in the Americas: Amerindians, Afro-descendants, Jewish Americans, and Japanese Americans. Tosta uses the experience of the American nations as a springboard to problematize the concept of the contemporary nation, an identity marked by border-crossings and other experiences of deterritorialization. Based on the exploration of “confluence narratives,” Tosta argues that the “contemporary” nation is not as contemporary as one may think. Informed by postcolonial theory and transnational and ethnic studies, this book offers an important

comparative study for and of inter-American literature. Its analysis of the representation of cultural encounters within distinctive national histories underscores the complex nature of ‘otherness’ in the Americas, as well as the inherently transcultural aspect of a trans-continental American identity.

In the first part it presents a comprehensive review of scientific data to show the already visible effects of each of the different environmental crises and its consequences to human life on Earth. In the second part, Luiz Marques critically discusses what he calls the three concentric illusions that prevent us from realizing the gravity of the current socio-environmental crises: the illusion of a sustainable capitalism, the illusion that economic growth is still capable of providing more well-being and the anthropocentric illusion. Finally, Marques argues that "fitting" back into the biosphere will only be possible if we dismantle the expansive socioeconomic gear that has shaped our societies since the 16th century by moving from a Social Contract to a Natural Contract, which takes into account the whole biosphere. According to him, the future society will be post-capitalist or it will not be a complex society, and even perhaps, we must fear, no society at all. One of the most significant developments in school education in recent years has been the development and introduction of standards, a subject of considerable controversy. This book is the

result of a symposium held in Kiel, a symposium that was arranged by two leading science education groups, one at IPN (Leibniz Institute for Science Education at the University of Kiel) in Germany and the other at the University of York, UK. The seminar brought together experts from 15 countries. These countries include those that have extensive experience with the effects of standards on the educational system, on individual schools and teachers and on students. In Part A, two of the organizers set the scene, describing the reasons for arranging the symposium and outlining the preparations and the work done at the meeting. Part B contains 17 reports from the 15 countries and in Part C, there are two summaries, analysing the conclusions, taken from two different vantage points. The controversies surrounding standards remain. However, this book gives a succinct and authoritative overall account of the advantages and disadvantages of their introduction taken from the experiences of many countries.

O livro *Inquietudes Sociológicas: Ensaio sobre Gênero, Sexualidade, Cultura, Ensino de Sociologia e Educação* está organizado em oito capítulos e duas grandes seções: "Gênero, sexualidade, cultura e educação" e "Ensino de Sociologia". No primeiro capítulo, a partir da análise das memórias de estudantes do ensino médio sobre a percepção da homossexualidade no espaço escolar, há um retrato dramático da homofobia em colégios de Teresina. O segundo capítulo sintetiza uma pesquisa sobre as representações e vivências sociais de jovens estudantes da educação básica em relação ao gênero e sexualidade. O capítulo seguinte já compreende uma etnografia sobre comportamentos e sentidos partilhados por jovens no interior de uma escola: para além da lógica dos papéis sociais, a pesquisa demonstra uma diversidade de atitudes juvenis no cotidiano de um colégio público. O próximo capítulo estuda como se apresenta o machismo explícito e o velado entre alunos de uma turma universitária. O quinto capítulo discute a presença do assédio sexual no ambiente universitário: por meio de entrevistas de mulheres, caracteriza a prática violenta do assédio em uma universidade pública. O primeiro capítulo da segunda seção discorre sobre a construção da autonomia docente entre estudantes de uma licenciatura em Ciências Sociais. O artigo seguinte avalia a história do ensino da Sociologia no Brasil, algumas de suas regulamentações e, além de analisar significados construídos por estudantes do ensino médio sobre a disciplina de Sociologia, o perfil geral dos docentes de Sociologia na educação básica

pública de Teresina. O último capítulo compreende um estudo exploratório sobre o ensino da Sociologia em uma escola privada de Teresina, uma espécie de sociologia do conhecimento que analisa o desenvolvimento da disciplina no cotidiano escolar.
