Jones portrays Freud's childhood and adolescence; the excitement and trials of his four-year engagement to Martha Bernays; his early experiments with hypnotism and cocaine; the slow rise of his reputation and constant battles against distortion and slander; the painful defections of close associates; the years of international eminence; the onset of cancer and his stoicism in the face of an agonizing death. Homosexuality and Italian Cinema Mimesis

This book is the first to establish the relevance of same-sex desires, pleasures and anxieties in the cinema of post-war Italy. It explores cinematic representations of homosexuality and their significance in a wider cultural struggle in Italy involving society, cinema, and sexuality between the 1940s and 1970s. Besides tracing the evolution of representations through both art and popular films, this book also analyses connections with consumer culture, film criticism and politics. Giori uncovers how complicated negotiations between challenges to and valorization of dominant forms of knowledge of homosexuality shaped representations and argues that they were not always the outcome of hatred but also sought to convey unmentionable pleasures and complicities. In tutto il Paese la commozione è assoluta: per la prima volta nella storia, un sovrano rinuncia al trono per amore di una donna. Gli succede suo fratello Bertie, re Giorgio VI. Edoardo, privato di tutti i suoi titoli, deve abbandonare l'Inghilterra, e quattro mesi dopo sposa Wallis Simpson in Francia. Il giorno delle nozze riceve una lettera da suo fratello con la quale Bertie gli comunica di aver proibito che Wallis riceva il trattamento di Altezza Reale, che pure le spetterebbe dopo il matrimonio. Edoardo non gli perdonerà mai quest'umiliazione. Nel settembre del 1939 scoppia la guerra tra Gran Bretagna e Germania. Giorgio VI nomina generale il fratello Edoardo e lo invia nei dintorni di Parigi. Otto mesi dopo, di fronte all'imminente disfatta francese, i duchi di Windsor si rifugiano a La Croë, la loro residenza in Costa Azzurra. E poco dopo decidono di fuggire dal Paese. Però non scappano in un luogo sicuro come la Gran Bretagna, Gibilterra o il Portogallo, bensì in Spagna, una

nazione amica della Germania nazista che con ogni probabilità è in procinto di dichiarare guerra all'Inghilterra. Nessuno riesce a comprendere un comportamento così strano. A giugno del 1940, il duca e la duchessa di Windsor arrivano al Hotel Ritz di Madrid, dove il maggiore Sinclair, aiutante di campo di Edoardo, viene misteriosamente assassinato. Da qui comincia questo romanzo. Juan Vilches è avvocato, docente di Giurisprudenza e capo del dipartimento legale dell'Istituto spagnolo di tecnologia aerospaziale.
