This period is one of great interest, for in it are included the reigns of Seti I., and Raineses II., and Rameses III., and Menephtah, under which Egypt attained to a very high state of prosperity, and became the mistress of the trade of the Red Sea and of the Mediterranean Sea. The country was not given up to the making of military expeditions and raids, as under the great

kings of the XVIIItk Dynasty, but it has been truly said that the general wealth of the country was greater during the reign of Rameses III. than during that of Tliothmes III., although the hold of Egypt upon her Syrian, Libyan, and Nubian possessions was less strong and less secure.
