Advances in Formal Slavic Linguistics 2018 offers a selection of articles that were prepared on the basis of talks presented at the conference Formal Description of Slavic Languages (FDSL 13) or at the parallel Workshop on the Semantics of Noun Phrases, which were held on December 5-7, 2018, at the University of Göttingen. The volume covers a wide array of topics, such as situation relativization with adverbial clauses (causation, concession, counterfactuality, condition, and purpose), clause-embedding by means of a correlate, agreeing vs. transitive 'need' constructions, clitic doubling, affixation and aspect, evidentiality and mirativity, pragmatics coming with the particle *li*, uniqueness, definiteness, maximal interpretation (exhaustivity),

kinds and subkinds, bare nominals, multiple determination, quantification, demonstratives, possessives, complex measure nouns, and the NP/DP parameter. The set of object languages comprises Russian, Czech, Polish, Bulgarian, Macedonian, Serbo-Croatian, and Torlak Serbian. The numerous topics addressed demonstrate the importance of Slavic linguistics. The original analyses prove that substantial progress has been made in major fields of research.

It has been calculated that not more than 1500 Cyrillic books were printed before the year 1701, and the aim of this catalogue is to give particulars and locations of over 200 copies of some 160 works which are preserved in British and Irish collections. The books come from presses that were sited in present-day Montenegro, Italy, Romania, the Czech Republic, Lithuania, Serbia, Germany, England, Sweden, The Netherlands, Russia, Belarus and Ukraine. Almost all of the books are rare (the 13 copies of the Ostrih Bible being a notable exception); many of them are the only, or the least imperfect, copies known. England's early contacts with Muscovy meant that books were acquired by English merchants and brought home as curiosities. Their trophies survived undisturbed in libraries, rather than

suffering the fate of being handled to destruction in their native lands. The same phenomenon applies to the bindings. Early preservation in libraries also means that a large number of interesting contemporary manuscript annotations have also survived in these copies. Such individual features (bindings and inscriptions) have been carefully noted in the catalogue. Full and detailed bibliographic descriptions have been given for works not adequately described elsewhere in the published literature.

This book is dedicated to Anna Siewierska, who died, far too young, in 2011. It contains 15 contributions by 20 linguists who may be counted among the foremost scholars in the field of linguistic typology. All of these articles discuss a topic that is prominent in Anna's work, whose journal articles and monographs on the passive, on word order, and on the category of person are standard literature in these respective fields. Mindful of Anna's last monograph, Person, the majority of the contributions in this volume discuss free and bound person forms, argument indexing, reference tracking systems, impersonals, and related issues, such

as suppletion and incompleteness in person paradigms, the origin of referential systems, dependent versus independent marking, and referential hierarchies. Other topics are grammatical alignment, grammatical voice, ditransitives, and word order. Most of the contributions take a broad, typological perspective. Others give a more in depth treatment, based on data from a specific language, notably Spanish, Russian, Mandinka, and Mohawk. The book contains a complete bibliography of Anna Siewierska's linguistic production.

The rest were not published as the newspaper was suppressed by the authorities.

This book uses the reaction of a number of biologists in the United States and Great Britain to provide an overview of one of the most important controversies in Twentieth Century biology,

the “Lysenko Affair.” The book is written for advanced undergraduate and graduate students of history/history of science. It covers a number of topics which are relevant to understanding the sources and dimensions of the Lysenko controversy, including the interwar eugenics movement, the Scopes Trial, the popularity of Lamarckism as a theory of heredity prior to the synthesis of genetics and Natural Selection, and the Cold War.
