Contingency theory is a general theory which says that there is no one singular best way to structure your organization and lead your team. Instead, the best way to do this will be contingent on the situation. So, contingency theories examine how best to run your team or organization given different situations. Fiedler's Contingency Theory of Leadership - with Examples Situational/Contingency Model Overview 'Situational' (or 'Contingency') leadership models are based on the idea that the leader's actions should vary according to the circumstances he or she is facing - in other words leadership methods change according to the 'situation' in which the leader is leading. As early as 1948, Ralph Stogdill stated that "the qualities, characteristics, and skills required in a leader are determined to a large extent by the demands of the situation in which he is to function as a leader." Contingency theories (CT) are a class of behavioral theory that contend that there is no one best way of organizing / leading and that an organizational / leadership style that is effective in some situations may not be successful in others. Summary of Contingency Theory (Fiedler, Hersey, Blanchard ... The contingency approach, often called the "Situational Approach" is based upon the premise that all management is essentially situational in nature. All decisions by managers will be affected (if not controlled) by the contingencies of a given situation. There is no one good way to address any decision. Contingency Approach or Situational Approach to Management ... One classic approach that gained prominence during the 1970s and 1980s is contingency theories of leadership. Contingency theories hold that leadership effectiveness is related to the interplay of a leader's traits or behaviors and situational factors. Situational and Contingency Leadership Theory The main difference is that situational theory tends to focus more on the behaviors that the leader should adopt, given situational factors (often about follower behavior), whereas contingency theory takes a broader view that includes contingent factors about leader capability and other variables within the situation. Contingency Theory - Changing minds (December 2016) Situational Leadership Theory, or the Situational Leadership Model, is a model created by Paul Hersey and Ken Blanchard, developed while working on Management of Organizational Behavior. The theory was first introduced in 1969 as "life cycle theory of leadership".
