The text, which incorporates the author's final revisions, records the play as it was produced at the Hippodrome Theatre Workshop in Gainesville, Florida, in 1979.

The thirteen one-act plays collected in this volume include some of Tennessee Williams's finest and most powerful work. Only one of these plays (*The Purification*) is written in verse, but in all of them the approach to character is by way of poetic revelation. Whether Williams is writing of derelict roomers in a New Orleans boarding house (*The Lady of Larkspur Lotion*) or the memories of a venerable traveling salesman (*The Last of My Solid Gold Watches*) or of delinquent children (*This Property is Condemned*), his insight into human nature is that of the poet.
