The 42 études have remained a core part of the teaching repertoire since their publication, and are today perhaps the most common set of studies for intermediate and advanced students of the violin. They were written to demonstrate the possibilities of the Tourte bow, which was then innovative but has since been universally adopted, meaning Kreutzer's studies are highly applicable to the development of modern bowing technique. Another of Kreutzer's important didactic goals was developing fluency in contraction and extension of the left hand, which is also crucial to modern students of the violin. Nearly a century after its initial publication, Carl Flesch's Scale System remains one of the foremost scale books for violin. This comprehensive collection of exercises features the 24 major and minor scales, with emphasis on both double-stops and arpeggios. With Flesch's exercises, the intermediate player will progressively master intonation, shifting, rhythm, string crossing, bow speed and pressure, and tone production. Initially published as a supplement to Book 1 of The Art of Violin Playing, Flesch's Scale System has become the principal scale study for serious violinists. Carl Flesch (1873-1944) was born in Hungary and began playing the violin at age seven. He was a famous chamber musician, instructor, and solo performer, who mastered repertoire ranging from

Baroque to contemporary works.

Originally titled 42 Etudes for Solo Violin (Études ou Caprices pour Violon) by Rodolphe Kreutzer (1766-1831), this edition was adapted and transcribed for Viola solo by Roisber Narvaez, they are currently considered fundamental for the acquisition of the technique of the viola's modern performance, used by teachers in universities and music conservatories around the world. These etudes expose a progressive series in which the basic principles are reflected up to technical complexity of the instrument. In this edition, we faithfully keep fingerings and bowings the composer based on the first edition consisting of 40 Etudes are preserved and were published by the Magasin de Musique directed by Mrs Cherubini, Méhul, Kreutzer, Rode, N. Isouard et Boieldieu, founded in 1802. However, we are maintaining the order and numbering of the modern editions and use the sequence of the first edition, with numbers 13 and 25 in the order that appears revised edition of Joseph Clavel, pupil, and assistant to the violin chair of Kreutzer. We faithfully maintain the fingerings and bowings of the first edition of Kreutzer and add the missing elements from the 3rd revised edition of Clavel but always returning back to the first edition in those cases where necessary. We kept the use of the C-clef as much as possible to facilitate the reading for the performer, except for those very sharp extracts that merit the use of the G-clef. There is a Manuscript that contains 25 studies, 13 of which can be identified as preliminary version, since fingerings that do not appear in the first edition were taken from here and were added in our version Roisber Narvaez Verlag in italics, we have also placed annotations from the first edition in parentheses and editor's suggestions in brackets. Isouard et Boieldieu, fundado en 1802. Mantuvimos tanto como sea posible el uso de la clave de Do para facilitar la lectura al ejecutante, salvo aquellos extractos muy agudos que ameritan el uso de la clave de Sol. Existe un Manuscrito que contiene 25 estudios, 13 de los cuales se pueden identificar como versión preliminar, pues de aquí fueron tomadas digitaciones que no aparecen en la primera edición y fueron agregadas en nuestra versión Roisber Narvaez Verlag en letra cursiva, también hemos colocado entre paréntesis anotaciones de la primera edición y entre corchetes sugerencias del editor.

Franz Wohlfahrt: 60 Studies for the Violin, Op45 (Etudes No. 1-60) Jan Hrimaly: Scale-Studies for Violin Rodolphe Kreutzer: 42 Studies (Etudes) or Caprices for the Violin Wohlfahrt's book (Franz Wohlfahrt: 60 Studies for the Violin, Op45) is actually originally two books of 30 Etudes each, combined into 60 Etudes or studies. The Etudes are a bestselling mainstay of violin study and are a must-have for any violinist. The sixty studies which increase in difficulty are wonderful for learning technique and also notes. The studies are fun to play while learning and designed to reinforce and enhance the student's technical foundation. They are not your normal boring scales. They are small pieces of actual music that concentrate on technique. Playing actual music versus scales puts more demand on the bow arm, so the learning is more conducive to actually applying the technique musically. Great to be used in conjunction with the two other violin technique books in this volume. Hrimaly's book (Jan Hrimaly: Scale-Studies for Violin) of scales & scale based exercises is a classic of violin technique teachings. Hrimaly was an influential Czechoslovakian teacher and violinist. He was associated with the Moscow Conservatory for forty six years. These are his progressive scale studies in 10 sections. The many different scales and arpeggios are a great teaching for all levels and will never be outgrown by the student. Kreutzer's book (Rodolphe Kreutzer: 42 Studies

[Etudes] or Caprices for the Violin) is a must have for serious violin students. For intermediate to early advanced violinists the famous exercises are standard repertoire. The compilation of the 3 complete books is comprised of scans of pre 1923 sheet music by various music publishers. Overall it's a warts and all (although we have cleaned up and digitally enhanced as much as possible) reproduction of some very old manuscripts so there are some minor printing imperfections owing to the age and quality of these original manuscripts. We hope you get a lot of benefit from performing the many various exercises in this book and with consistent practice takes your piano playing technique skills to a new level.

Complete Scale-Studies: For the Violin Alfred Music

Rodolphe Kreutzer (1766-1831) creator of the 42 Études ou Caprices pour Violon, considered fundamental for the acquisition of the technique of modern violin execution, exposing a series of progressive studies in which he was able to translate the basic principles to a technical complexity of the instrument. The first edition consists of 40 Etudes and they were published by the Magasin de Musique dirigé par Mrs Cherubini, Méhul, Kreutzer, Rode, N. Isouard et Boieldieu, founded in 1802. The publisher's number (411) points to 1805, and the Publisher's address of Rue de la Loi (renamed Rue de Richelieu in 1806), plus an advertisement in the Allgemeine musikalische Zeitung of January 1806, confirm 1805 as the year of publication. The printed information Propriété de l'Auteur and Déposé à la Bibliothèque Impériale (deposited in the Imperial Library) in Paris. Etudes 13 and 25 of our version do not appear in the first edition. Possibly the edition of Alessandro Rolla, perhaps it was one of the first editions to expand to 42 Etudes where it mentions that it adds two unpublished studies of the composer. However, the composer made a new edition, revised and corrected by the author, entitled 40 Études ou Caprices pour le Violon. Paris Chez J. Frey (legal successor to Magasin de musique), it contains the two new Etudes 13 and 25 excluding 1 and 12, in addition, making several modifications to studies 23, 28 and 34. However, in Etude 23 the change is so noticeable that we had to add the version of the first edition from 1805 to our appendix. Now, his pupil and assistant professor Joseph Clavel clearly based his version on the revised edition by Kreutzer, it contains the same modifications that the composer made. Etude 22 was arbitrarily altered in an early 1806 reprint, the publisher Breitkopf & Härtel, perhaps wishing to improve the page turns, shortened this Etude by 15 bars and thus altering part of the work, erroneously many modern editions have maintained this to this day present. Although there has not been a single version that contains the 42 Etudes like those presented in our Urtext edition, it is known at least they all belong to Kreutzer, consequently, we are maintaining the order and numbering of modern editions and we use the sequence of the first edition, with numbers 13 and 25 in the order that appears revised edition of Joseph Clavel. Despite this, we faithfully keep fingerings and bowings from the first edition of Kreutzer and add the missing elements from the 3rd revised edition of Clavel but always going back to the first edition in those cases where necessary.
