The first two chapters cover computer basics, including managing files and knowing your way around the operating system. Once you have worked through all the technology related introduction chapters, you will explore four chapters on various aspects of hand sketching. The intent is that the reader would recreate these drawings as they appear in the book. The goal is to focus on understanding the process and developing the required techniques rather than getting bogged down in design right away.
