As Lerato's story unfolds, you'll meet her quick-fingered, beer-loving, man-eating mom June-Rose, who's not afraid to use the knife she keeps in her bra, and has passed on her tough survivor's spirit to her daughters, especially 12-year-old Florence. When June-Rose brings home yet another man, Florence runs away with dire consequences. Revelations emerge, such as the truth about Lerato's father, who lost his way in the conflicts at the end of apartheid. Rich and humorous, this vibrant coming-of-age story sees a young woman uncover her skill as a writer, explore her sexuality, travel, and finally understand her mother.
