And it speaks with a peculiar timeliness to citizens of the United States who would understand their neighbors to the south. Samuel Ramos's avowed

purpose is to assist in the spiritual reform of Mexico by developing a theory that might explain the real character of Mexican culture. His approach is not flattering to his fellow citizens. After an analysis of the historical forces that have molded the national psychology, Ramos concludes that the Mexican sense of inferiority is the basis for most of the Mexican's spiritual troubles and for the shortcomings of the Mexican culture. Ramos subscribes to neither of the two major opposing

schools of thought as to what norms should direct the development of Mexican culture.
