Yet within a generation their names, accomplishments, and the aesthetic ideal that guided them virtually disappeared from the history of American art. *Art Work: Women Artists and Democracy in Mid-Nineteenth-Century New York* recaptures the unfamiliar cultural landscape in which spirited young women, daring social reformers, and radical artisans succeeded in reuniting art and industry.
