Semen is the vessel that transports HIV. Live sperm in the blood stream is the virus like property that brakes down the immune system. The pH of the stomach is neutralized allowing millions of sperm cells, in a single ejaculate, into the circulatory system after swallowing semen. Within the hepatic portal system, the inferior mesenteric vein brings blood upward from the descending colons and rectum. 80% of its blood flow comes from capillaries in the stomach and intestines. CXCR4 and CCR5 are the HIV receptor sites identified by scientists today. Protein C binds to receptors of blood vessels and white blood cell's. Protein X, hyaluronidase found in the anterior portion of a sperm cell is the component of CXCR4, HIV-1. Chemists use the designation R to represent two or more alkyl groups present in a molecule. Phagocytosis, is the process used to wrap membrane around spermatoids and viruses, engulfing them; thus CCR5, HIV-2.
