By the end of the twentieth century there were some half-million tractors on British farms - more machines than people to drive them. such as hydraulic systems and cold-starting aids. He includes a glossary and full index. This book replaces the author's earlier, successful, *Fifty Years of Farm Tractors*. Many of the photographs are new and the text has been brought up to date to include developments of the early twenty-first century.
