Many interesting design trends are shown by the six papers on

operational amplifiers (Op Amps). Firstly, there is the line of stand-alone Op Amps using a bipolar IC technology which combines high-frequency and high voltage. Finally, Rinaldo Castello shows us how to provide output power with CMOS buffer amplifiers. The combination of class A and AB stages in a multipath nested Miller structure provides the required linearity and bandwidth.
