For those in developed nations, suddenly being without electricity is a disaster: power cuts have us fretting over the food stored in the freezer, and even a few hours without lights, televisions, or air conditioning is an ordeal. How can electric power be brought into their lives when the centralized utility models that have evolved in developed nations are not an economically viable option? Hisham Zerriffi shows that in each case, it is not simply a matter of matching a particular technology to a particular need. Numerous institutional factors come into play including the regulatory regime, access to financial services, and government/utility support or opposition to the DG alternative. Despite this, in many

countries, the question is not whether DG has a role to play. Rather it is a question of how it will play a role.
