In an era of declared crises--economic, ecological and climatic, among others--the notion of soft systems has gained increasing traction as a counterpoint to permanent, static and hard systems. Acknowledging fluid and indeterminate situations with complex feedback loops that allow for reaction and adaption, the possibility of soft systems has reentered the domain of design. The examples displayed in "Bracket goes soft" are offered as nothing more than a short catalog of soft systems--some explicitly architectural, others geological, others entirely metaphorical. In all cases, these examples explore how the notion of going soft can be iterated across professions, disciplines, and fields of research. The book is divided into the themes "sensing/feedback"; "interfacing/ enveloping";

"subverting/hijacking"; "formatting/ distributing"; "contingency/ resilience"; "diffusing/generating". Bracket is a book series structured around an open call that highlights emerging critical issues at the juncture of architecture, environment, and digital culture. The editorial board and jury for Bracket 2 includes Benjamin Bratton, Julia Czerniak, Jeffrey Inaba, Geoff Manaugh, Philippe Rahm, Charles Renfro, as well as co-editors Neeraj Bhatia and Lola Sheppard. The book is the first on the adventures of British secret agent Simon Sinclair who works mainly for Counter Terrorism Intelligence (Operations), or CT3, in conjunction with MI5, MI6 and the CIA. The book is a 'future threat' scenario, the threat in question being technologically feasible on grand scale as far back as the mid 1980s when an accident at Vektor, one of Russia's then 50 Biological Warfare facilities, infected Ustinov with Marburg filovirus which evolved in the 15 days it took to liquefy all his organs into 'Marburg Variant U' which was then put atop SS16 rockets. In this gripping tale a recombinant or 'dual' virus is smuggled into England by CABAL, the Confederation

Against British-American Logisticians, an international group opposed to British and American power and influence that CABAL sees as hegemony. CABAL gives seven days notice of attacks on London. After a CABAL attempt on his life Sinclair follows his attacker to Colombia where he learns the identities of four CABAL 'money men' and captures one of them, the money trail left by these financiers leading to the identity of CABAL's operational leaders. Sinclair succeeds in thwarting four CABAL bomb attacks and stops helicopters heading to London with the virus, but not without fallout which threatens an epidemic. First symptoms of smallpox appear, and then those of a new and highly virulent strain of Marburg filovirus which causes haemorrhagic fever and liquefaction of the organs. Sinclair finds a cure for the recombinant virus in Russia and spread throughout London, if not England or internationally, is avoided. Many CABAL members have been captured or killed and for good measure Sinclair captures two of the three remaining top organizers still at large. Reflecting on a very hectic three weeks during which England faced the greatest threat in its history, Sinclair realizes that there is a mole in CT3, leaving him a difficult future assignment but, at the same time, giving him an idea that might, given time, help shut down major terrorist organizations such as CABAL and Al Qaeda for good.
