To Kill a Mockingbird by Harper Lee is a brilliant book (written in 1960) with some great lessons. The plot is a loose account of the events that unfolded in the author's hometown when she was 10 years old. Her father, Atticus Finch, is a lawyer who is defending a seemingly innocent black man (Tom) accused of raping a white girl.

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
