Roy Rockwood was a house pseudonym used by the Stratemeyer Syndicate for boy's adventure books. The Stratemeyer Syndicate was the creation of Edward Stratemeyer, whose

ambition was to be a writer la Horatio Alger. He succeeded in this ambition (eventually even writing eleven books under the pseudonym "Horatio Alger"), turning out inspirational, up-by-the-bootstraps tales. In Stratemeyer's view, it was not the promise of sex or violence that made such reading attractive to boys; it was the thrill of feeling "grown-up" and the desire for a series of stories, an "I want some more" syndrome. Works written under that name include: *Five Thousand Miles Underground*; or, *The Mystery of the Centre of the Earth* (1908), *Jack North's Treasure Hunt* (1907) and *Lost on the Moon*; or, *In Quest of the Field of Diamonds* (1911).
