The bees will arrive, pack mud into the tubes, and begin pollinating all the plants in your backyard. Twenty experiments and activities reveal even more about bees—how to smell like a bee, understand the role of flowers and pollen, learn how bees

communicate with each other through “dance,” and more. It's the real buzz on bees, delivered in the most ingenious and interactive way.
