(Merriam-Webster). Before the covenant can be executed, there must first be proof that the person who writes the testament has deceased. If there isn't proof of the persons' death, then by no means possible can the testament be executed by those entitled to inherit the will and/or by anyone else. Under today's standards, this rule still applies, and we find this to be true even in the Holy Scriptures.
