Over the past two decades, profound changes in Israel opened its society to powerful outside forces and the dominance of global capitalism. Yet a verse translation derives from historical, biographical, and philosophical research, interpretive analysis of the original poem, and continuous linguistic and prosodic choices that parallel those

the poet made.
