This book deals with the circumstances that led to a warring between President of India Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, Prime Minister of India Dr. Manmohan Singh and Congress President Mrs. Sonia Gandhi. About ten men in India remove the public resources by controlling the public mind. They rule India through suitable men. They are the ruling class of India. The United Progressive Alliance (UPA) defeated the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) in the Indian General

Election held in May 2004. The leaders for the UPA and the NDA were Mr. Atal Behari Vajpayee and Mrs. Sonia Gandhi respectively. After the declaration of results, Congress President Mrs. Sonia Gandhi enjoyed the support of 338 members in the 543 member house. She turned down the request of the allies to become the Prime Minister of India mainly because the ruling class did not relish it. Therefore, Dr. Manmohan Singh of the Congress Party was sworn in as the Prime Minister of India on 22 May 2004. The new Finance Minister was Mr. P.Chithambaram. During and before the General Election, Congress President Mrs. Sonia Gandhi said that the NDA Government cheated the people by alienating the national assets like the Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs). She gave a solemn assurance that she would protect the national assets. She added that her party would not change its policies daily. The composition of the ministry showed that the Prime Minister and the Finance Minister owed their positions to the ruling class of India. Finance Minister Mr. P.Chithambaram - within a week of taking charge on 30 May 2004- said that the verdict of the people was not against the so-called reform process but against the communal agenda of the NDA. Further, he said that "the assurance of the United Progressive Alliance (UPA) to protect the Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) was limited to those PSUs, which are capable of making profits in a sustained manner in a globally competitive environment". He was echoing the views of the ruling class. All right thinking people felt that they were being stabbed from the back. Within days, the Government gave unlimited amount of public money to the ruling class in the pretext of buying shares. It decided to

reduce the shareholding in the banks and the other PUSs to 51 per cent. It handed over the Hyderabad, Delhi and Mumbai airports to its promoters..It alienated many other assets without the knowledge of the people. It did everything in very bad faith. The Congress President stood by Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh like a rock. Her son, Mr. Raghul Gandhi, wielded great influence in the Congress Party. He too gave a good certificate to Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh. Thus, they betrayed the trust of the people. The President of India, Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam could not prevent many unconstitutional manipulations. Therefore, he talked about corruption wherever he went. The people felt that his words were directed against Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh and Congress President Mrs. Sonia Gandhi. At times he did not spare the judges. The media stopped reporting his words. Then he wrote an article and supplied it to the newspapers. The Hindu alone published it. The article was the climax of the warring. Then he controlled his words due to the reasons known to him. Finally, Finance Minister P. Chithambaram announced that the financial institutions would be restrained from buying shares or advancing money to buy shares. This went down as his greatest achievement. He failed to give freedom to Indians. However, his actions were mainly responsible for the growth of this writer. But for him, the ruling class might have turned India upside down. He proved that the nature of India is not the nature of the ruling class or the nature of the Prime Minister of India but it is the nature of the President of India.
